

## YOUR BULK SERVICE HAS CHANGED

Dear Owner/ Resident

Glasgow City Council now operates a limited *by-request-only* service for bulk uplifts. This means the council will NO LONGER be collecting bulky waste from designated pick-up points on 'bulk day'.

Residents can request a bulk uplift for a maximum of 10 items on MyGlasgow App or by using the online request form on our website.

Please only present your bulk waste on the day before your Collection Date.

Items must be placed within the grounds of your property (e.g. a backcourt or garden) and ensure it does not obstruct bins or common pathways. Leaving items on the street or in a back lane will be regarded as fly-tipping and the people responsible will be open to enforcement action.

## **KEEP OUR STREETS CLEAN - HELP STOP FLYTIPPING WITHIN YOUR COMMUNITY**

We are asking local residents to report flytipping and fly tippers. Have you observed someone dumping their waste on the street? Have you got vehicle registration details? Let us know by using the MyGlasgow APP & report an incident via our online contact form at https://www.glasgow.gov.uk/reportpublichealth. This can be done anonymously.

Public Health investigates fly-tipping in order to identify those responsible. Fixed Penalty Notices of £200 may be issued for illegally dumping rubbish or bulky waste. Leaving waste on our streets encourages vermin into urban areas which is a health hazard.
